Westminster, February 11.

**T**HIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Septimus Robinson, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

*An Act for continuing, and granting to His Majesty, certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and sixty-five.*

*An Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax, to be raised in Great Britain, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and sixty-five.*

*An Act for extending the Time, granted by an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for allowing His Majesty's Subjects to import their Goods and Effects, being the Produce of certain Places ceded to France and Spain by the late Treaty of Peace, upon Payment of the same Duties, as they would have been liable to, if the same Places had remained in His Majesty's Possession.*

*An Act to indemnify such Persons, as have omitted to Qualify themselves for Offices and Employments; and to indemnify Justices of the Peace, Deputy Lieutenants, Officers of the Militia, or others, who have omitted to register, or deliver in, their Qualifications, within the Time limited by Law; and for giving further Time for those Purposes.*

And to Five Private Bills.

Lisbon, January 26. Their most Faithful Majesties and the Royal Family have been at Salvaterra ever since the 19th. The Court went into Mourning Yesterday for Twenty Days, for the late Princess Hedwige Sophia Augusta, Sister to the King of Sweden. Six Mails are

due from Falmouth, our last Letters being of the 11th of December, and no Packet appears; but as the Wind is now fair, we may hourly expect one.

Vienna, January 30. Their Imperial Majesties came to Town from Schonbrun on Monday Night; and the King and Queen of the Romans made their Entry Yesterday Morning. In the Evening there was a Drawing-Room in Grand Gala.

Turin, January 30. The Count de Lavrian, his Sardinian Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Lisbon, having applied for his being recalled from that Court, the Count de Scarnafaggi has been appointed to succeed him in the same Character.

Berlin, February 2. Last Wednesday the King of Prussia, attended by the Prince Royal and young Prince Henry of Prussia, and the two Princes of Brunswick in this Service, set out from hence for Potzdam.

The King has been pleased to grant unto William Markham, Doctor of Laws, one of His Majesty's Chaplains in Ordinary, the Deanry of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary in Rochester, void by the Death of Doctor John Newcome, late Dean thereof.
