HIS Day His Majefty came to the Houfe of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Septimus Robinfon, Knt. Gentleman Ufher of the

mus Robinfon, Knt. Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to,

An Act for continuing, and granting to His Majefly, certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One thoufand feven hundred and fixty-five.

An Act for granting an Aid to His Maje/ly by a Land Tax, to be raised in Great Britain, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and sixty-five.

An Ast for extending the Time, granted by an Ast passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for allowing His Majesty's Subjects to import their Goods and Effects, being the Produce of certain Places ceded to France and Spain by the late Treaty of Peace, upon Payment of the same Duties, as they would have been liable to, if the same Places had remained in His Majesty's Posses

An Act to indemnify fuch Perfons, as have omitted to Qualify themselves for Offices and Employments; and to indemnify Justices of the Peace, Deputy Lieutenants, Officers of the Militia, or others, who have omitted to register, or deliver in, their Qualifications, within the Time limited by Law; and for giving further Time for those Purpofes.
