**M.** De Braniski, whom his Polish Majesty has appointed his Envoy Extraordinary at this Court, arrived here on the 2d Instant from Warsaw; and it is expected that the King of Prussia will, in a very few Days, come hither, in order to give an Audience to that Minister.

*Hague, March 12.* Yesterday in the Afternoon the Earl of Buckingham arrived here from Peterburgh, and proposes to set out for England in a few Days.

Great Rejoicings have been made throughout the Seven Provinces on Occasion of the Birth-Day of the Prince of Orange, who entered into the Eighteenth Year of his Age on the 8th Instant.
