Yefferday the King of Berlin, March 9. Pruffia, accompanied by the Prince Royal, and young Prince Henry of Pruffia, and the two Princes of Bruniwick, arrived here from Potzdain. His Majesty, in his Way to the Palace, vilited the Manufactory of China, The fame Afternoon arrived also the Reigning Prince of Anhalt Deffau; and in the Evening the Marriage of that Prince with the Princess Louisa Henrietta Wilhelmina, youngest Daughter to Margrave Henry the King of Prussia's Cousin, was declared at Court. This Day the Ceremony of Betrothing was performed. His Pruflian Majesty, the rest of the Royal Family, the Reigning Prince of Anhalt Deffau, and the Hereditary Prince of Courland, dined with the Queen of Pruffia ; and at Night Prince Ferdinand, the King's Brother, gives a grand Supper and Ball to the Royal Family. The King of Pruffia had a numerous and splendid Levée in the Morning, and M. de Branifki, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, had his first Audience, when he delivered his Letters of Credence to his Pruffian Majefty.

Dantzig, March 6. The King of Poland has been pleafed to confirm all the former Privileges of this City. The Pruffian Troops begin to draw off from these Territories.

Hamburgh, March 12. Count Raab, the Imperial Minister, returned here this Asternoon from Vienna.

On Tuesday last M. Bonn, March 14. d'Ammon, one of the Directors of the Circle of Westphalia, and the King of Prussia's Refident at Cologne, died at that Place.

## Navy-Office, March 14, 1765.

The Honourable the House of Commons baving come to the following Refolution, viz.

" That all Persons interested in, or intitled unto, any Bill or Bills, payable in the Courfe of the Navy or Victualling Offices, or for Transports, which were made out on or before the 30th Day of June 1764, who shall, on or before the 26th Day of this Instant March, carry the fame (after having had the Interest thereupon computed to the 6th Day of April next, and marked upon the faid Bills, at the Navy or Victualling Office refpectively) to the Office of the Treasurer of His Majefty's Navy, shall have in Exchange for the fame, from such Treasurer or his Paymaster, or Cashier, a Certificate to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, for every entire Sum of One or more Hundred Pounds of which fuch Bill or Bills, together with the Intereft fo marked, shall confist, until the feveral entire Sums of One or more Hundred Pounds, for which fuch Certificates are to be made forth, shall amount together to 1,500,000 l. and also one other Certificate for the fractional Part of One Hundred Pounds, being the Remainder of fuch Bill or Bills ; and the Perfons who shall be possessed of fuch first mentioned Certificates of the entire Sum of One or more Hundred Pounds, shall, upon Delivery thereof to the faid Governor and Company, be intitled, in respect of the fame, to the Annuities hereafter mentioned ; That is to fay, For two fifth Parts of the Sums there-in mentioned, to an Annuity after the Rate of 31. per Cent. redeemable by Parliament, and transferable, and paid at the Bank of England: For two other fifth Parts thereof to a proportionable Number of Tickets of the Value of 101. each, in a Lottery to confift of 60,000 Tickets; every Blank to be of the Value of 61. the Blanks and Prizes to be attended with the like 3 l. per Cent. Annuities; and for the remaining one fifth Part, to a like Annuity, after the Rate of 3 l. per Cent. with Liberty to convert the fame into an Annuity for Life, after the fame Rate, with Benefit of Survivorship, in Manner following; that is to fay, Every Perfon who shall become posselled in Right of 1001. capital Stock, of an Annuity of 3 l. in fuch last-mentioned Annuities ; and shall produce, on or before she 5th Day of April,

1766, a Certificate thereof, attefled by the Cashier of the Bank of England, to the Auditor of the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer, shall, in lieu thereof, be entitled, from the faid 5th Day of April, 1766, during the Life of the Nominee whom he thall appoint, to a Life Annuity of 31. payable at the Exchequer, out of the Sinking Fund; and the feveral Nominees to be appointed in respect of such Life Annuities, to be divided into Classes, the whole Annuity belonging to each Class not to be less than 1500 l, if Life Annuities to that Amount, shall be fo subscribed; and upon the Death of every Nominee, the Annuity fo fallen in, to be distributed among the Survivors of the fame Clafs.

"And the Annuities, in Respect of the faid first Two fifth Parts, shall be immediately added to, and made a Part of, the Joint Stock of Annuities reduced from 4 to 3 per Cent. and Confolidated, pursuant to certain Acts of Parliament made in the 25th and 26th Years of the Reign of His late Majefty; and the Annuities attending the faid Lottery, together with such of the Annuities, in Respect of the faid One-fifth Part as thall not be exchanged for Annuities on Lives, with the Benefit of Survivorship, in Manner above mentioned, shall also be added to, and made a Part of, fuch Joint Stock, from the 5th Day of April 1766; and all the faid Annuities, transferrable and paid at the Bank, shall commence from the faid 5th Day of April 1765, and he payable Half yearly, on the 10th Day of October, and the 5th Day of April, in every Year, out of the Sinking Fund.

" But in Cafe the feveral entire Sums of One or more Hundred Pounds, for which Certificates are to be granted by the Treasurer of His Majefty's Navy or his Paymaster, or Cashier, in respect of such Bills to to be delivered in, on or before the 26th Day of this Instant March, and of the Interest marked thereon, shall not then amount in the Whole to 1,500,000 l. all Perfons possessed of the above-mentioned Certificates for the Fractional Parts of 1001. or of Navy, Victualling or Transport Bills, which were made out on or before the 30th Day of June, 1764, and do not amount, together with the Interest thereupon computed to the 6th Day of April next, to 100 l. may, on or before the 5th Day of April next, after having had the Interest upon such Bills marked in fuch Manner as is before mentioned, bring the fame to the Office of the Treafurer of His Majesty's Navy, and shall have in Exchange for the fame from fuch Treasurer, or his Paymaster, or Cashier, a Certificate to the said Governor and Company of the Bank of England for the Sums contained in fuch Certificates, and for the Amount of the Principal and Intereft of which fuch Bills shall con-fift; and upon Delivery thereof, and Payment of fo much Money to the faid Governor and Company as shall, with the Sums fo certified, amount to 1001. shall be intitled to the Annuities and Advantages before-mentioned : And if any fuch Certificates for Fractional Parts shall not be delivered in and subfcribed as aforefaid, on or before the faid 5th Day of April next, they shall be paid according to the Course of the Navy, in such Order as the Bills in Part of which they were granted, were payable, and fuch of them as were granted in Part of Bills bearing Interest, shall from the faid 5th Day of April next, carry the like Interest to which such Billis were in-titled."

The Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majefty's Navy do hereby give Notice thereof, that all Per-fons poff find of Navy or Transport Bills, made out as aforefaid, bringing the fame to this Office, the Interest due thereon will be computed and marked, in order to their being carried to the Treasurer's Office in Broad-Street accordingly.
