Whereas on Monday the 25th of February last, about Twelve o'Clock at Night, a Gang of Smuglers, to the Number of 20 or thereabouts, all on Horseback, armed with large Hedge Stakes, Clubs, and other offensive Weapons, were assembled in a Lane leading to the House of Mary Noyce, in the Parish of Pagham in the County of Sussex, in order to be aiding and assisting in the Rescue of a large Quantity of Brandy, which had been seized by Hyde Warnett, Thomas Baker, and John Wheatley, Officers of His Majesty's Customs in the Port of Chichester, who in the due Execution of their Office, were forcibly and violently obstructed, and 40 Cases of the said Brandy, so by them seized, were, by the said Smuglers, rescued and taken away,
