*A Resolution and Order of the House of Commons, Jovis 28<sup>o</sup> die Martii 1765.*

RESOLVED,  
**T**HAT one Fourth Part of the Capital Stock of Annuities, after the Rate of Four Pounds per Centum per Annum, granted in Respect of certain Navy, Victualling, and Transport Bills, and Ordnance Debentures, delivered in and cancelled, pursuant to an Act of the Third Year of His Majesty's Reign, be redeemed and paid off on the 25th Day of December next, after discharging the Interest then payable in respect of the same.

*Copenhagen, March 12.* On the 7th Instant the High Court of Justice was opened here with the usual Solemnity. The Post, due Yesterday from Hamburg, is not yet arrived, the Passage of the Great Belt being obstructed by floating Ice: Two Mails are due from England.

*Berlin, March 12.* Last Sunday the King of Prussia returned to Potsdam, and the same Day Prince Henry set out for Rhinsberg.

*Berlin, March 16.* On Thursday last, Prince Frederick of Brunswick was thrown from his Horse as he was taking the Air near Potsdam by which he was much hurt by the Fall.

*Lisbon, March 16.* Their most Faithful Majesties, and the Royal Family, returned from Salvaterra the 2d Instant. The Fleet for the Rio de Janeiro will put to Sea with the first fair Wind. The King of Portugal has appointed Dom John de Lancafter to succeed the Count d'Ega, as Vice-Roy of the Indies. Count Lavriano, the King of Sardinia's Minister at this Court, having requested to be recalled, Count de Scarnafis is appointed to succeed him.
