A Resolution and Order of the House of Commons, Jovis 28° die Martii 1765.

RESOLVED, AHAT one Fourth Part of the Capital Stock of Annuities, after the Rate of Four Pounds per Centum per Annum; granted in Respect of certain Navy, Victualling, and Transport Bills, and Ordnance Debentures, delivered in and cancelled, pursuant to an Act of the Third Year of His Majesty's Reign, be redeemed and paid off on the 25th Day of December next, after discharging the Interest then payable in respect of the same.
