**W**HEREAS the Burglary and Robbery committed in the East-India Company's Bullion Office at this House, between Saturday Evening last and this Morning, appears to have been effected by Means of a strong Iron Crow, and a Spike Gimblet, which were found upon the Premises, answering the following Descriptions, viz. the Iron Crow quite new, very sharp pointed, and squared two Inches upwards from the Point, three Feet ten Inches long, and marked on the back Part next the Claw with a jagged or bearded Arrow, nine Inches long. The Gimblet likewise new, marked HV on one Side of the Handle, with a burning Iron, and the Word VINCENT stamped on one Side of the Iron, about two Inches from the Handle, and bores a Hole of five-eighths of an Inch Diameter.
