Navy Office, March 29, 1765.

THE principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy hereby give Notice, that all Persons possessed of Certificates granted for the Fractional Parts of Navy Bills, or for Transports, subscribed in Part of 1,500,000 l. pursuant to a Resolution of the House of Commons; and also those possessed of Navy or Transport Bills made out on or before the 30th of June 1764, and do not amount, together with the Interest thereupon, computed to the 6th Day of April next, to 100 l. may, on or before the 5th Day of April next, after having had the Interest upon such Bills marked in this Office, as is mentioned in the said Resolution, carry the same to the Office of the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, and shall have in Exchange for the same, from such Treasurer, or his Paymaster, or Cashier, a Certificate to the said Governor and Company of the Bank of England for the Sums contained in such Certificates, and for the Amount of the Principal and Interest, of which such Bills shall consist; and upon Delivery thereof, and Payment of so much Money to the said Governor and Company, as shall with the Sums so certified amount to 100 l. shall be entitled to the Annuities and Advantages mentioned in the said Resolution.
