

Navy-Office, April 10, 1765.

The Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy give Notice, that on Tuesday the 23d of this Month, at Eleven o'Clock in the Morning precisely, they will expose to Sale at this Office, several Lots of old Stores, consisting of Junk, Paperstuff in Ropes, Hammaccoes and Canvas in Rags, Bostrope, Refuse Ends, Nets, Buntin, and Ground Toes, lying in His Majesty's Yard at Chatham; where any Persons willing to be Purchasers, may have the Liberty of viewing them at any Time in the common working Hours of the said Yard till the Day of Sale.
