HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houle of Commons by Sir Septimus Robinson, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Reyal Allent to feveral Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the Houfe of Peers, to hear the Commission reaa; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Chamberlain of His Majefty's Household, and several other Lords, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to,

An Act for the more effectual Prefervation of Fish, in Fish-Ponds and other Waters; and Conies in Warrens; and for preventing the Damage done to Sea Banks, within the County of Lincoln, by the breeding Conies therein.

An AET for enlarging the Terms and Powers of Two AETs, of the I birteenth of George the First and of the Sixteenth of his late Majesty, for re-pairing feveral Roads, leading from the Tuwn of Warminfler, in the County of Wilts; and for amending feveral other Reads near the faid Town; and for repealing fo much of an Act, made in the First Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing several Roads therein, mentioned, in the faid County, as relates to the Road within the Town of Heytesbury; and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of fo much of an Act, made in the Twenty-feventh Year of the Reign of his late Majesty, for repair-ing feveral Roads, in the Counties of Dorset and Devon, as relates to the Road from Penn Inn, in the County of Dorfet, to the Workhoufe at the East End of the Town of Honiton, in the County of Devon, and to the Road from the Intrenchment on Afkerfwell Hill to Penn Inn, and from Bridport to Beamister; and for repairing and amending feveral other Roads, therein mentioned, in the Counties of Dorfet and Devon.

An Act for repairing and widening, and keep-ing in Repair, the Road leading from the Turn-pike Road on Hurst Green, in the County of Suffex, through Etchingham and Burwash, to the Extent of the faid Parifb of Burwash, in the said County.

An Act to continus the Term, and alter and enlarge the Powers of an Act, paffed in the third Year of His prefent Majesty, for repairing, widening, surning, and keeping in Repair, the Road from the

Soham; and for building a Bridge cross the River Ouze, at or near a Prace called Stretham Ferry, in the County of Cambridge; and for repairing and widening and making jeveral other Roads adjoining to the Roads directed to be repaired and widened by the faid Act.

An Act for repairing and widening the Roads leading from the Turnpike Road at Kipping Crofs, in the Parish of Brenchley, in the County of Kent, through the Parifhes of Brenchley, In the County of Iden, and Goudhurft, by the Left Hand Side of Iden Green, to the Turnpike Road on Wilfley Green, in the Parish of Cranbrooke; and from a Place near Goudhurst Gore, through the Parish of Mar-den, to Stile Bridge, in the faid Parish; and from Underden Green in Marden aforefaid, to Wanshutts Green, in the County of Kent.

An Act for amending the Road from the Pinfold, in Balb, in the County of York, to Workfop in the County of Nottingham.

An Act to continue the Term, and enlarge the Powers, of an Act paffed in the Second Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefly. for repairing and widening the Road from Mullen's Pond, in the County of Southampton, to the Eighteen Mile Stone from the City of Salifbury, and feveral other Roads in the jaid Act mentioned; and also for repairing and widening feveral other Roads, leading out of the faid Roads; and for other Purpofes therein mentioned.

An Act for enlarging the Terms and Powers of feveral Acts of the Ninth and Twelfth Years of Queen Anne, and of the Thirteenth of King George the First, and of the Fourteenth of His late Majesty, for Repairing the Highways leading from Roylion, in the County of Hertford, to Wansford Bridge, in the County of Huntingdon, fo far as relates to the Middle and South Divisions of Roads comprised in the said Acts ; and for Amending the Road from the Town of Huntingdon, to the Caufeway, at or near the West End of the Town of Somerscham, in the faid County of Huntingdon.

An Act for repairing, widening, and keeping in Repair, the Road, leading from the Turnpike Road at Wrotham Heath, in the County of Kent, to the Turnpike Road leading from Croydon to Godstone, in the County of Surrey.

An Act for repairing and widening the Road, from Tonbridge to Maidstone, and from Watis Cross to Cowden, in the County of Kent.

An Act for repairing and widening the Roads, from the South End of Newton Abbot, to the Passage Way in Kingfwear, opposite Clifton Dartmoth Hard-ness; and from the End of a Lane leading out of the Turnpike Road, between Newton Abbot and Totness towards Abbots Kerfwell, to Five Lanes, and from Languers Barn, to the faid Turnpike Road, between Newton Abbots and Totness; and from Galmpton Warborough, to Monks Bridge and Brix-Town of Cambridge to Ely, and from thence to bam Quay; and from Languers Barn, to the North

End
