IS Catholick Majefty, the Queen Mother, and all this Royal Family, arrived here Yesterday, as well as the greatest Part of the Foreign Ministers.

Prince Czartoriníki, who paffed by Florence incognito, arrived lately at Rome, to announce the Election of the King of Poland, A Confittory was appointed for the first Day after Easter, in which the Pope was to acknowledge him; after which the Bulls for the vacant Bishopricks in that Kingdom of the King's Nomination, were to be difpatched.

St. James's, April 28. This Day M. Roussel, Minister from the Bilhop of Liege, had his first private Audience of Her Majefty.
