*Petersbourg, April 9.*

**C**OUNT Malachowski, who was sent by his Polish Majesty, to notify his Coronation to the Empress, left this Place on Friday last, and he is soon to be followed by M. Soltikoff, who is appointed to go to Warsaw to return the Compliment.

*Warsaw, April 10.* The Bishop of Cujavia is to go, in a few Weeks, to Dantzic, to receive, in the King's Name, the Homage of that Town.

*Florence, April 20.* By Orders from Vienna to hasten the Dispositions for the Arrival of the Archduke, a great Number of Workmen of all Sorts are to be added to those employed at the Palace.

The Marquise Riccardi, and Madame Antinori, two Widow Ladies here, have been appointed to receive the Archduchess at the Place she debarks at, to attend her to Inspruck, and from thence to Florence.

*Berlin, April 20.* On Thursday last M. de Braniski, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, had his Audience of Leave of the King of Prussia at Sans Souci, where his Prussian Majesty still continues. Last Night there was a very numerous and splendid Court, and afterwards a grand Supper in the Queen of Prussia's Apartment.

*Berlin, April 23.* Last Sunday M. de Braniski, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, had his Audience of Leave of the Queen of Prussia and the Rest of the Royal Family; and proposes to set out, on his Return to Warsaw, in a few Days.

*Hague, April 26.* The Transport, with Part of the Dutch Troops from the Berbices, which was missing, is got safe into the Isle of Rhé.

*St. James's, April 26, 1765.*

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, on Tuesday the 16th Day of this Instant April, early in the Morning, James Knight, of Walham Green, in the Parish of Fulham, in the County of Middlesex, (being, as is supposed, on his Return Home from London) was found robbed, and barbarously murdered by a Pistol Shot, (which Shot has been since extracted from him) near a House in the Parish of Chelsea, known by the Name, or Sign, of the Cow and Calves, in the High Road between Knightsbridge and Little Chelsea; and that the said Robbery, and barbarous Murder, were committed by some Person or Persons unknown: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said horrid Crimes, is, hereby, pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them who shall discover his Accomplice, or Accomplices in the said Facts, (except the Person who

actually committed the said Murder) so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

If therefore any Buyer of Wool finds himself aggrieved by any such Deceit, and will send Information thereof in Writing, unto Mr. Hills, Attorney, in East-lane Rotherhithe, London, Clerk to the Company of Merchants of the Staple of England, the same will be forthwith communicated by him to the Committee for the Management of such Prosecutions.
