HIS Day being the Anniversary of the King's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and brilliant App-arance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment His Majesty on that Occasion. Noon the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired; and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court, and Bonfies, Illuminations, and other Publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.

Copenhagen May 25. On Monday last the King of Denmark came to Town: His Majesty dined by the Way with the Queen-Mother at Hirscholm, where he was met by the two young Princes. His Majesty only passed the Night in this City, and returned the Day following to Friedensbourg.

Last Wednesday the Prince Royal reviewed his own Regineent of Infantry, who went through their whole Exercise, commanded by

his Royai Highness in Person.

Berlin, May 25. Wednesday and Thursday last the Troops assembled here for the Review, were again drawn up in the Plain of Templow, and exercised before his Prussian Majesty, who was extremely well pleased with them. A great Number of the General Officers had the Honour of dining every Day with his Majesty during his Stay here. Thursday in the Afternon his Mejesty went to Charlottenbourg, where he remained till this Morning, and then set out with his Nephews, the Prince Royal and young Prince Henry of Prussia, and the two Princes of Brunswick in this Service, for Custrin and Stargardt, in order to review the Troops assembled in those Places. His Royal Highness Prince Henry the King of Prussia's Brother, likewise set out this Morning from hence for his Country-Seat at Rhinsberg. The hence for his Country-Seat at Rhinsberg. feveral Regiments, that had been ordered hither for the Review, marched out of this Place on Friday Morning early for their respective Garrifons.
