That Letters between London and any Port within the British Dominions in America, (in which all His Majefty's West-India Islands are included) shall pay Single One Shilling, Double Two Shillings, Treble

Three Shillings, the Ounce Four Shillings. That Letters, by Sea, from any one Port to any other Port within the faid Dominions, fhall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence

That Letters, by Land, to or from any Chief Post-Office in America, from or to any other Part thereof not exceeding Sixty Miles from fuch Chief Post Office, or from the Office where fuch Letters, not paffing through a Chief Office, may be put in, fhall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence. And being upwards of Sixty, and not exceeding One Hundred Miles within the faid Dominions, shall pay Single Six Pence, Double One Shilling, Treble One Shilling and Six Pence, the Ounce Two Shillings.
