Genoa, May 18.

THIS Republick has fixed on the Palaces of the Dukes of Doria Turfis and Spinola to lodge the Infanta of Spain and the Princess of Parma: Another Palace Spinola is to be fitted for lodging Part of those Princesses Suite; and two large Convents are fitting to lodge the Servants of inferior Rank.

Berlin, May 28. The Hereditary Prince of Courland, who has been here ever since last February, took Leave of the King of Prussia, on the 23d Instant, at Charlottenbourg; and after taking Leave also of the Queen and the rest of the Royal Family, he sat out last Sunday for Cassel and Brunswick, but intends to return hither to assist at the Celebration of the Prince of Prussia's Marriage.

Hague, June 4. The Prince of Orange, with Prince Lewis of Brunwick, sat out Yesterday Morning for Soefdyck, where they arrived in perfect Health the same Afternoon, and will reach Loo this Day.

The King has been pleased to grant unto the Right Honourable Charles Townshend, Esq; the Office of Receiver and Paymaster-General of all His Majesty's Forces, in the Room of the Right Honourable Henry Lord Holland.
