Stockholm, June 4. H E whole Royal Family dined in Town Yesterday, and were in the Evening at the French Comedy; after which they returned to Ulrickfdahl, where there is to be a Court To-morrow

for the Foreign Ministers.

Turin, June 8. Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Dutchess of Savoy are gone for three or four Weeks to the Vigne la Reine, a pleafant Seat of the King of Sardinia near Turin, whose falutary Air, it is hoped, may contribute to the more speedy Recovery of her Royal Highness, whose State of Health has never been very

well fince her late Lying-in.

The French Ambassador at this Court is preparing to go to Genoa, in order to pay a Compliment from the King his Master to both the Infantas of Spain and Parma, on their Passage through that Place; and the Spanish Ambasfador here is likewise going thither, to be prefent at the Reception of these two Princesses. The Imperial Minister is also on the Point of his Departure from hence, to go to Inspruck, for the Time of the Celebration of the Archduke Leopold's Marriage with the Infanta of Spain, who is expected at Genoa about the 20th of next Month.

They had last Week at Nice an Alarm, occasioned by three Algerine Ships cruifing in Sight of their Coast; these Ships took at that Time a Catalan Vessel laden with Wine, and disappeared after having anchored 24 Hours near

Antibes.
