A PROCELAMATION, For continuing Officers in the Isle of Man. GEORGE R.

HEREAS by an Act made in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for carrying into Execu-"tion a Contract made, purfuant

" tion a Contract made, pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the Twelfth of " His late Majefty King George the First, be-tween the Commissioners of His Majefty's " Treasury and the Duke and Dutchess of \* Atholl, the Proprietors of the Ifle of Man, \*\* and their Truftees, for the Purchafe of the " faid Island and its Dependencies, under certain " Exceptions therein particularly mentioned," it is enacted, That from and immediately after the Payment into the Bank of England, by Us, Our Heirs, or Succeffors, in the Names of John Duke of Atholl, and Charlotte Dutchefs of Atholl his Wife, Baronefs Strange, Sir Charles Frederick, Knight of the most Honourable Order of the Bath, and Edmund Hoskins, Esquire, or the Survivors or Survivor of them, of the Sum of Seventy Thouland Pounds, on or before the First Day of June, in the Year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and fixtyfive, the Island, Castle, Pele, and Lordship of Man, and all the Iflands and Lordships to the faid Island of Man appertaining, together with the Royalties, Regalities, Franchifes, Liberties, and Sea-Ports to the fame belonging, and all other the Hereditaments, and Premifies, therein particularly defcribed and mentioned (except as therein is excepted) should be, and they were thereby unalienably vessed in Us, Our Heirs, and Succeffors, freed and discharged, and abfolutely acquitted, exempted, and indemnified, of, from, and against, all Estates, Uses, Trufts, Entails, Reversions, Remainders, Limitations, Charges, Incumbrances, Titles, Claims, and Demands whatfoever : And whereas We have caufed to be paid into the faid Bank of England, in the Names of the faid Duke and Dutchefs of Atholl, Sir Charles Frederick, and Edmund Hofkins, the faid Sum of Seventy Thoufand Pounds, on the Seventeenth Day of May laft paft, whereby, and by virtue of the faid Act of Parliament, the immediate Care of Our faid Ifland, and of Our loving Subjects therein, is now devolved upon Us: And whereas by Our Commiffion, bear-ing even Date with these Prefents, We have conflituted and appointed Our trufty and wellbeloved John Wood, Elquire, to be Our Governor in Chief, and Captain General, in and Over Our faid Island, Pele, and Lordship of Man, and all the Islands, Forts, Castles, and Lordthips, thereunto appertaining: We, being defirous to provide for the due and regular Administration of Justice within Our faid Island of Man, and the Territories and Dependencies to the fame appertaining, and to fecure the Peace and

good Order thereof, and to promote, to the utmost of Our Power, the Happiness and Profperity of all Our loving Subjects reliding within the fame, have thought fit, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby strictly commanding and requiring all Manner of Perfons whatfo-ever, to pay due Regard and Obedience to the faid Act of Parliament, and Our faid Royal Commission, and chearfully and dutifully to fubmit themselves to Our said Governor fo appointed by Us as aforefaid, and to be aiding and affifting to him, and all other Our Magiftrates and Officers, in the lawful Discharge of the Authorities to them committed and intrufted, as they will answer the contrary at their And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Perils. all Officers and Ministers who now are, or at the Time of the Publication of this Our Royal Proclamation within Our Island of Man, shall be concerned in the Administration of Juffice within Our Island aforefaid, and par-ticularly Our Clerk of the Rolls, Attorney-General, and Two Deemsters, and all other Perfons whatfoever, who, at the Times afore-faid, are or fhall be duly and lawfully poffeffed of, or invefted in, any Civil Employ-ment (except only the Officers appointed and employed by the late Proprietors of Our Island of Man, in collecting and receiving the Revenues arifing within Our faid Island, and the Territories and Dependencies of the fame) fhall from henceforth hold their respective Offices, Places, and Employments of, from, and under, Us, Our Heirs, and Succeffors, and shall continue in the Exercife thereof, and fhall enjoy the fame, with fuch Salaries, Fees, Profits, and Emoluments, as have hitherto belonged to the fame respectively, until Our Royal Pleasure in this Behalf shall be further known: And We do strictly command and enjoin all and every the faid Perfons, of whatfoever Rank, Condition, or Degree, to proceed in the Execution of their faid refpective Offices, and to perform all the Duties thereunto belonging, upon Pain of Our higheft Displeasure: And We do further charge and command all and every Our faid Magistrates, Officers, and Ministers, and all Persons whatfoever, who shall hold any Office, Place, or Employment, Ecclefiastical, Civil, or Military, within Our faid Island of Man, and the Territories and Dependencies of the fame; that within the Space of One Calendar Month from and after the Publication of this Our Proclamation within Our faid Island, they do take the Oaths appointed to be taken by an Act of Parliament paffed in the First Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the First, intituled, "An A& for the further Security of His " Majefty's Perfon and Government, and the "Succeffion of the Crown in the Heirs of the " late Princel's Sophia, being Protestants; and " for extinguishing the Hopes of the pretended " Prince of Wales, and his open and fecret " Abetters;" and also make and fubscribe the

Declaration

Declaration mentioned in an A& of Parliament made in the Twenty fifth Year of the Reign of of King Charles the Second, intituled, "An " Act for preventing Dangers which may hap-pen from Popish Reculants," in the Prefence of Our faid Governor, his Lieutenant, or Deputy, or in the superior Court or Courts of Record in Our faid Island, upon Pain of Our highest Difpleafure, and as they will answer the contrary. at their utmost Perils: And Our Will and Pleafure further is, that all Jurifdictions and Authorities whatfoever, which were heretofore carried on and exercifed in the Name of the Lord of Our faid Ifland of Man for the Time being, or of any other Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, and which are now vefted in Us, Our Heirs, and Succellors, by virtue of the faid Act of Parliament, shall be henceforth carried on and exercifed in the Name of Us, Our Heirs, and Succeffors only: And that all Writs, Precepts, Proceffes, Orders, Injunctions, and all other Forms of Law and Justice, and all Acts of State and Policy, for the due Ordering and Government of Our faid Island, and the Territories and Dependencies thereunto belonging, shall be iffued and executed in the Name, and by the Authority, of Us, Our Heirs, and Succeffors, or of Our Governor or Lieutenant, or Deputy Governor, for the Time being, appointed or to be appointed by-Us, Our Heirs, and Succeffors, and in no other Name, and by no other Authority whatfoever : And we do hereby fitictly command and enjoin Our faid Governor, and all other Our Magiftrates and Officers, within Our faid Island, and the Territories and Dependencies to the fame belonging, to see this Our Royal Proclamation duly carried into Execution; and to caufe the fame to be publickly read in all the principal Towns of the faid Island, between the Hours of Eleven in the Morning and Two in the Afternoon; and printed Copies thereof to be affixed in the most publick Places of the fame, and to be distributed to all the Ministers of Churches, Chapels, and other Places of Religious Worship, within Our faid Island, and the Territories and Dependencies thereunto belonging : And we do hereby laftly charge and command all Ministers of Churches, Chapels, and other Places of Religious Worfhip aforefaid, publickly to read this Our Royal Proclamation therein, on the next Lord's Day after they shall receive the fame, during the Time of Divine Service, immediately before the Homily or Sermon, upon Pain of our Higheft Difpleafure.

Naples, May 28. Some Days ago a Shock of an Earthquake was felt at Tiano and Mignimo in the Terra di Lavoro, between Thirty and Forty Miles diftant from Naples. At Migniano it was fo violent as to drive out the Inhabitants; three Houses were thrown down, and two Churches much damaged.

Naples, June 4. A few Days ago arrived from Rome, a melancholy Account of the Death of Baron Werpup, a very amiable young Hanoverian Gentleman, who, with his Valet de Chambre, was overturned in his Chaife near Rome, and both were unfortunately killed on the Spot.

Berlin, June 4. Yesterday Morning early the King of Pruffia let out from Potzdam for Yefterday Morning early Magdebourg, in order to make a Review of the

Troops there, Laft Sunday Morning Prince Dolgoruki, the Ruffian Minister at this Courts waited on her Royal Highness, Confort to Prince Henry the King of Pruffia's Brother, and delivered to her Royal Highness, with great Cere-mony, the Empress of Russia's Letter, together with the Order of St. Catherine. In the Evening that Princefs, decorated with the Order. went to Schonhausen, the Queen of Pruffia's Summer Palace, where there was a very numerous and splendid Court; from whom her Royal Highnels received the Compliments fuitable on the Occasion.

Berlin, June 11. The King of Prussia ar-tived laft Sunday in perfect Health, at Potzdam from Magdebourg. The Prince Royal, young Prince Henry of Pruffia, and the two Princes of Brunfwick, in this Service, fet out from Magdebourg for Brunfwick with their Uncle Prince Ferdinand, Governor of Magdebourg, to make Vifit to that Court.

Lieutenant General Hulfen, Governor of this Capital, who had also accompanied his Majefty in his Journey to Magdebourg, returned hither laft Sunday Evening.

Dresden, June 10. Count Wurmbrand, who was the Imperial Minister at the Court of Denmark, is appointed to fucceed Count Sternberg here in the fame Character : And Count Vitzdom, named by this Court as Envoy Extraordinary at Vienna, will fet out very foon for his Place of Refidence.

Hague, June 14. His Royal Highness the Duke of York landed at Helvoe fluys, in perfect Health, on Wednefday Morning at Three Quarters past Ten. His Royal Highness was received, by Order of the States of Holland, with all Military Honors at that Port, and at the Brille, and arived here at Five o'Clock the fame Though his Royal Highness was Evening. pleafed to declare his Intention of being incog. yet he permitted every Body to pay their Court to him Yesterday Morning without Ceremony, and to fee the Ladies in the Evening at a Ball at the Houle of Sir Joseph Yorke.

Hague, June 18. His Royal Highness the Duke of York intends to proceed from hence to Germany, about the latter End of this Week, and to vifit Amfterdam and Utrecht in his Way.
