**A** FEW Days ago Baron Knyphausen, formerly Minister from the King of Prussia in England, was named First Commissary for Extraordinary Commercial Affairs.

*Hague, June 25.* His Royal Highness the Duke of York left Utrecht this Morning at Four o'Clock, in perfect Health; and intended to be at Loo by One in the Afternoon, where he was to dine with the Prince of Orange, and to continue his Journey towards Hanover in the Evening, where, it is imagined, he will arrive on Friday next. The River was covered with a prodigious Number of Boats which accompanied his Royal Highness's Yacht, and which formed the most agreeable Sight it is possible to imagine.
