PUBLICK Notice is hereby given, That by an Act paffed the latt Seffion of Parliament, "For altering certain Rates of Poffage, and for i: amending, explaining, and enlarging feveral Pro"، vifioris in the Att of the Ninth of $Q$ lueen Anne, " and other Att relating to the Poit-Office;" It is, amongit other Things, Enatted,
That Letters between London and any Port within the Britijh Dominions in America, (in which all His Majefty's Wef-India Illands are included) thall pay Single One shilling, Double Two Shillings, Treble Three Shillings, the Ounce Fout Shillings.
That Letters, by Sea, from any one Port to any other Port within the faid Dominions, fhall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Sthilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence.
That Letters, by Land, to or from any Chief Poot. Office in America, from or to any other Part thereof not exceeding Sixty Miles from fuch Chief Polt Offire, or from the Office where fuch Letters, not pafing through a Chief Office, may be put in, thall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence. And being upwards of Sixty, and not exceeding One Hundred Miles within the faid Dominions, thall pay Single Six Pence, Double One Shilling, Treble One Shilling and Six Pence, the Ounce Two Shillings. And being upwards of One Hundred, and not exceeding Two Hundred Miles within the faid Dominions, fhall pay Single Eight Pence, Double One Shilling and Four Pence, Treble Two Shillings, the Ounce Two Shillings and Eight Pence. And for every Diftance not exceeding One Hundred Miles above fuch Two Hundred, and for every fuch further Diftance within the faid Dominions, fhall pay Single Two Pence, Double Four Pence, Treble Six Pence, the Ounce Eight Pence.

Thas no Veffel hall be permitted to break Bulk, or make Entry in any Port within the Britijh Dominions, where Polls are or may be eftablified, until all Letters on board are delivered to the Poftmatter of fuch Port (he paying the Bringer One Penny for each Letter) to be forwarded according to their refpective Diretions, except fuch as are excepted by the Act of the Ninth of Queen $A n n e$; and fuch as may be brought by Veffels liable to Quarentine, which laft are tọ be delivered to the'Perfons faperintending the

Quarentine, for proper Care, beforie they agre forwarded by che Poft. And that all Mafters, Mariners, Paffengers, \&c. neglecting to deliver the Letters as aforefaid, fhall, for every Neglect, forfeit Twenty Pounds:
That the Poftmafter fhall take for every Letter brought by fuch Vèffel, for any Place within his Deliyery, One Penny, above the Penny paid to the Mafter or other Perion for the fame:
That Letters conveyed in Great Britaiti and Ireland, not exceeding one Stage, fhall pay Single One Pemny, Double Two Pence, Treble Three Pence, tho Ounce Four Pence: And in England, above one and not exceeding two Stages, Single Two Pence, Double Four Pence, Treble Six Pence, the Oance Eight Pence ; but thefe Rates are not to affect the PennyPoff,
That Letters paffing between England and Ireland; through Cartijle, Dumfries, Port Patrick, and Donagbadee, flall' pay the fame Rates of Englif, Scorth, Irijb, and Packet Pottage, according to the Diltance or Number of Stages they are conveyed in each Kingdom, as are fettied by the Att of the Ninth of Queen Anne, or by this Act.
That no Packet exceeding the Weight of Four Ounces fhall be fent by the Penny-Poft ; unlefs coming from, or pafing thereby to the General-Poft:
That Letters palfing between London and Hamburg $b$ fhall pay as Letters between London and all other Parts of Gernany; viz. Single One Shilling. Double Two Shillings, Treble Three Shillinge, the Ounce Four Shillings.
That any Officer of the Poft-Office fecreting or deltroying any Leiter, Bag or Mail of Letters, containing any Bank Note, Bill, or other Paper; Writing, or Order for the Payment of Money ; or flealing out of any Letter anywuch Bank Note, Bill, \&ci. on Conviction, fhall fuffer Death as a Felon.
That any Perfon robbing a Mail, in any Place or in any Manner whatfoever, although it may not appear that any one was put in Fear by fuch Robbery, thall, on Conviftion, fuffer Death as a Felon.
That any Officer of the Poft-Office, entrulted to take in Letrers, and receive the Poflage thereof, embezziling the Money received, or deftroying the Letters; or any Officer advancing the Rates on Letters, and not accounting for the adydoced Poftage, fhalls, on Conviction, be deemed guilty of Felong:

That any Poff-Boy having a Mail or Bag of Lettters under his Care, deferting the fame before his Arrival at the next Stage; or fuffering any other; Perion to ride on the Horfe or Carriage along therewith; or loitering on the Road; or.not, in all pollfble Cafes, conveying the Mail after the Rade of Six meafured Miles an Hourr, fhall, on Convilition, before. one Juftice of the Peace, be fent to the Houre of Correction for, any Time not exceeding One Month, nor lefs than Fourteen Days.

That any Poft-Boy, fingly, or in Combination with ochers, unlawfully collecting, or conveying Letters, or caufing the fame to be unlawfully conveyed, 隹ll, on Convition, before one Junfice of the Peace, forfeit Ten Shillings, to be paid to the Informer, for every Letter !o unilawfully collected. conveyed, or delivered. And if the Forfeiture is not immediately paid, thall be fent to the Houfe of Correction, for any Time not exceeding Two Months, mor lefs than One Month.
That all Rates of Letters, and all Forfeitures, mentioned in this Act, fiall be paid in Sterling Monéy of Great Britain.
