*Whereas my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have received authentic Information, That on the 30th of January last, about Nine o'Clock in the Morning, as a Ship called the Elizabeth of Dunkirk, Adrian Frederick, Master, was sailing from thence, bound for Bourdeaux, the said Ship was piratically and feloniously attacked on the High Sea near Pavensea, by two English Shallops or large Boats, the Crews of which by Force plundered and robbed the said Ship Elizabeth of several Chests of Merchandize to a very considerable Value, in Violation of the Law of Nations.*

*Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Justice the Persons guilty of the said Piracy and Robbery, are pleased to promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds unto or amongst such Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any of the Offenders guilty of the above-mentioned Offence, so as such Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof: Which Reward shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatsoever, by Samuel Seddon, Esq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of such Offenders.*

*And, as a farther Encouragement, His Majesty is pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of the said Offenders, who shall discover, and prosecute to Conviction, any one or more of the said Offenders.*

**T**HE King's Plate of One Hundred Pounds will be run for on Lewes Downs in Sussex, on Thursday the 8th of August next, by any Horse, Mare, or Gelding, being no more than Six Years old the Breeds before, as must be certified under the Hands of the Breeder, carrying twelve Stone, the best of three Heats, round the Course. To be shewn and entered at Verrall's Coffee-House in Lewes, on Wednesday the 7th Day of August next, or they are not to run for the said Plate: And if any Difference arises relating to their Age, Entering, or Running, the same to be determined by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, or whom he shall appoint, according to such His Majesty's Orders or Rules as shall be produced at the Place of Entering or Running for the said Plate.
