THE King has been pleafed to grant unto William Digby, Mafter of Arss, one of His Majelty's Chaplains in Ordinary, the Place and Dignity of a Canon of Chrift Church, in Oxford, void by the Death of Dr. Philip Barton

General Poft-Office, Fune 8, 1765.

PUBLICK Notice is hereby given, That by an Act paffed the laft Seffion of Parliament, For altering certain Rates of Poftage, and for " amending, explaining, and enlarging feveral Pro" vifions in the Act of the Ninth of Queen Anne, " and other Acts relating to the Poft-Office;" It is, amongt other Things, Enafted,

That Letters between London and any Port within the Britifb Dominions in America, (in which all His Majefty's Wef-India Ilands are included) thall pay Single One shilling, Double Two Shillings; Treble Three Shillings, the Ounce Four Shillings.

That Letters, by Sea, from any one Port to any other Port within the faid Dominions, fhall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence.

That Letters, by Land, to or from any Chief Poft Ofice in America, from or to any other Part thereof not exceeding Sixty Miles from fuch Chief Poft Office, or from the Office where fuch Letters, not paffing through a Chief Office, may be put in, fhall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence. And being upwards of Sixty, and not exceeding One Hundred Miles within the faid Dominions, hall pay Single Six Pence, Double One Shilling, Treble One Shilling and Six Pence, the Ounce Two Shillings. And being cpwards of One Hundred, and not exceeding Two Hundred Miles within the faid Dominions, fhall pay Single Eight Pence, Double One Shilling and Four Pence, Treble Two Shillings, the Ounce Two Shillings and Eight Pence. And for every Diftance not exceeding One Hundred Miles above fuch Two Hundred, and for every fuch further Diftance within the faid Dominions, fhall pay Single Two Pence, Double Four Pence, Treble Six Pence, the Ounce Eight Pence.

That no Veffel thail be permitted to break Bolk, or make Entry in any Port within the Britiß Dominions, where Pofts are or may be eftablifhed, until all Letters on board are delivered to the Poftmafter of fuch Port (he paying the Bringer One Penny for each Letter) to be forwarded according to their refpective Directions, except fuch as are excepted by the Act of the Ninth of Queen Anne; and fuch as may be brought by Veffels liable to Quarentine, which laft are to be delivered to the Perions fuperintending the Quarentine, for proper Care, before they are forwarded by the Polt. And that all Mafters, Mariners, Paflengers, \&c. neglecting to deliver the Letters as aforefaid, Thall, for every Neglect, forfeit Twenty Pounds.

That the Poftmafter fhall take for every Letter brought by fuch Veffel, for any Place within his

Delivery, One Penny, above the Penny paid to the Mafter or other Perfon for the fame.

That Letters conveyed in Great Britain and Ireland, not exceeding one Stage, Thall pay Single One Penny, Double Two Pence, Treble Three Pence, the Ounce Four Pence. And in England, above one and not exceeding two Stages, Single Two Pence, Dou. ble Four Pence, Treble Six Pence, the Ounce Eight Pence; but thefe Rates are not to affect the PennyPod.
That Letters paffing between England and Ireland, through Carlife, Dumfries, Port Patrick, and Denagbadee, fhall pay the fame Rates of Engli/h, Scotch, Irijib, and Packet Poltage, according to the Diftance or Number of Stages they are conveyed in each Kingdom, as are fettled by the ACt of the Ninth of Queen Anne, or by this Act.
That no Packet exceeding the Weight of Four Ounces thall be fent by the Penny-Poft; unlefs coming from, or paffing thereby to the General-Polt.
That Letters paifing between London and Hamburgh fhall pay as Letters between London and all other Parts of Germany, viz. Single One Shilling, Double Two Shillings, Treble Three Shillings, the Oance Four Shillings.

That any Officer of the Poft-Office fecreting or deltroying any Letter, Bag or Mail of Letters, containing any Bank Note, Bill, or orher Paper, Wriing, or Order for the Payment of Money ; or ftealing out of any Letter any fuch Bank Note, Bill, \&c. on Conviction, fhall fuffer Death as a Felon.
That any Perfon robbing a Mail, in any Place or in any Manner whatfoever, although it may not appear that any one was put in Fear by fuch Robbery, hall, on Conviction, fuffer Death as a Felon.
That any Officer of the Poft Office, entrufted to take in Letters, and receive the Poftage thereof, embezzling the Money received, or deftroying the Letters; or any Officer advancing the Rates on Letters, and not accounting for the advanced Poftage, fhall, on Conviction, be deemed guilty of Felony.

That any Poft-Boy having a Mail or Bag of Letters under his Care, deferting the fame before his Arrival at the next Stage; or fuffering any other, Perfon to ride on the Horfe or Carriage along therewith ; or loitering on the Road ; or not, in all po斤fble Cafes, conveying the Mail after the Rate of Six meafured Miles an Hour, fhall. on Conviction, before one Juftice of the Peace, be fent to the Houfe of Corrèction for any Time not exceeding One Month, nor lefs than Fourteen Days.

That any Poft-Boy, fingly, or in Combination with others, unlawfully collecting, or conveying Letters, or caufing the fame to be unlawfully conveyed, fhall, on Conviction, before one Jultice of the Peace, forfeit Ten Shillings, to be paid to the Informer, for every Letter fo unlawfolly collected, conveyed, or delivered. And if the Forfeiture is not immediately paid, thall be fent to the Houfe of Correction, for any Time not exceeding Two Months, nor lefs than One Month.

That all Rates of Letters, and all Forfeitures, mentioned in this Act, thall be paid in Sterling Money of Great Britain.
