gle Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence.

That Letters, by Land, to or from any Chief Poft. Office in Anevica, from or to any other Part thereof not exceeding Sixty Miles from fuch Chief Polt Offee, or trom the Office where fuch Letters, not pafling through a Chief Office, may be put in, fhall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence. And being upwards of Sixty, and not exceeding One Fiuadred Nifiles within the faid Dominions, hall pay Single Six Pence, Double One Shilling, Treble One Shilling and Six Pence, the Ounce Two Snillings. And being upwards of One Hundred, and not exceeding Two Hundred Miles within the faid Doniinions, thall pay single Eight Pence, Double One Shilling and Four Pence, Treble Two Shillings, the Ounce Two Shillings and Eight Pence. And for every Diftance not exceeding One Hundred Miles above fuch Two Hundred, and for every fuch further Diftance within the faid Dominions; fhall pay Single Two Penie, Dcuble Four Pence, Treble Six Pence, the Ounce Eight Pence.

That no Veffel fhall be permitted to break Bulk, or make Entry in any Port within the Br:itik Dominions, where. Polts are or may be eltablifhed, until all Letters on board aie delivered to the Poftmafler of fuch Port (be paying the Bringer One Penny for each Letter) to be forwarded according to their refpective Directions, except fuch as are excepted by the Act of the Ninth of Queen Anne; and fuch as mar be brought by Veffels liable to Quarentine, which latt are to be delivered to the Perfons fuperintending the Quarentine, for proper Care, before they are forwarded by the Poft. And that all Mafters, Mariners, Paffengers, \&c. neglecting to deliver the Letters as aforefaid, fhall, for every Neglect, forfeis Twenty Pounds.

That the Poftmafter fhall take for every Letter brought by fuch Veffel, for any Place within his Delivery, One Penny, above the Penny paid to the Malter or other Perfon for the fame.

That Letters conveyed in Great Britain and IreZand, not exceeding one Stage, hall pay Single One Penny, Double Two Pence, Treble Three Pence, the Ounce Four Pence. And in England, above one and not exceeding two Stages, Single Two Pence, Double Four Pence, Treble Six Pence, the Ounce Eight Pence; but thefe Rates are not to affect the PennyPoft.

That Letters paffing between England and Ireland, through Carlife, Dumfries, Port Patrick, and Donagbadee, fhall pay the fame Rates of Englifh, Scotch, Irifh, and Packet Poltage, according to the Ditance or Number of Stages they are conveyed in each Ringdom, as are fetcled by the Act of the Ninth of Queen Anne, or by this Act.

That no Packet exceeding the Weight of Four Ounces fhall be fent by the Penny-Poft; unlefs coming from, or paffing thereby to the General-Poft.

That Letters pafing between London and Hamburgh fhall pay as Letters between London and all other Parts of Germany, viz. Single One Shilling, Double Two Shillings, Treble Three Shillings, the Ounce Four Stiillings.
That any Officer of the Pof-Office fecreting or deftroying any Letter, Bag or Mail of Letters, containing any Bank, Note, Bill, or other Paper, Wriing, or Order for the Payment of Money; or ftealing out of any Letter any fuch Bank Note, Bill, \&c. on Conviction, Ihall fuffer Death as a Felon.

That any Perfon robbing a Mail, in any Place or in any Manner whatfoever, although it may not appear that any one was put in Fear by fuch Robbery, hhall, on Conviction, fuffer Death as a Felon.

That any Officer of the Poft-Office, entrufted to take in Letters, and receive the Poftage thereof, embezzling the Money received, or deftroying the Letters; or any Officer advancing the Rates on Letters, and not accounting for the advanced Poftage, fhall, on Conviction, be deemed gailty of Felony.

That any Pon-Boy having a Mail or Bag of Letters under his Care, deferting the fame before his Arrival at the next Stage; or fuffering any other, Perfon to ride on the Horfe or Carriage along therewith; or loitering on the Read ; or not, in all polfble Cafes, conveying the Mail after the Rate of Six meafured Mites an Hour, fhall. on Conviction, before one Juftice of the Peace, be fent to the Houie of Correction-for any Time not exceeding One Months. nor lefs than Fourteen Days.
'That any Polt-Boy, fing'y, or in Combination with others, unlawfully collecting, or conveying Letters, or caufing the iame to be unlawlully conveyed, Chall, on Conviction, before one Juftice of the Peace, forfeit Ten Shillings, to be paid to the Informer, for every Letter fo unlawfully collecied, conveyed, or delivered. Aad if the Forfciture is not immediately paid, hall be fent to the Houfe of Correction, for any Time not exceeding Two Months, nor lefs than One Month.

That all Raies of Lctters, and all Forfeitures, mentioned in this Act, fhall be paid in Sterling Mo. ney of Grect Britais.
The Rates eftablimed by this Act sor the Port of Letters between Louden and Hamburgh; and the Limitation of the Weight of Packets to be feint by the Penny-Poft, commence from the Fifib of $\mathcal{T} u l^{2}$ next. All other Regulations, Rates of Poflage, Painsa Penalties, and Forfeitures beforenentioned, commence from the Tents Day of Oetober wext.
