Office in America, from or to any othe Part thereof not exceeding Sixty Miles from fuch Chief Polt Office, or from the Office where fuch Letters, not paffing through a Chief Office, may be put in, fhail pay Single Four Pelice, Double Eight Pence, Trable One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Perce. And being upwards of Sixty, and not exceeding One Hundred Miles within the faid Dominions, shall pay Single Six Pence, Double One Shilling. Treble One Shilling and Six Pence, the Ounce Two Shillings.
