The King has been pleafed to conftitute and appoint John Leigh, Efq; to be Captain of Carrifbrook Caftle, and the Fortifications thereunto belonging, in the Isle of Wight. The King has been pleased to constitute and

appoint Charles Forbes, Esq; to be Captain of that Company whereof James Gorry, Efq; deceafed, was late Captain, in the 66th Regiment of Foot, commandad by Adam Gordon, Efq; commonly called Lord Adam Gordon.

The King has been pleafed to conftitute and appoint James Robertfon, Elq; to be Barrack Master General to all His Majesty's Forces ferving in North America.
