Venice, September 27.

A Few Days ago Chagi Abdurahman Aga, Envoy from the Bey of Tripoli, set out from hence on his Return.

The Spanish Ambassador has presented a Letter to the College from his Catholick Majesty, notifying the Marriage of the Prince of Asturias with the Infanta of Parma.

The Imperial Ambassador has notified to the College the Death of the late Emperor, and presented his Credentials from the new Emperor.

Florence, September 28. His Serene Highness Prince George Augustus of Mecklenbourg-Strelitz arrived here on the 22d Instant, and has been received by the Great Duke and Great Dutchess with the greatest Distinction and Civility.

Dresden, October 1. The Elector, Electress Dowager, and Administrator, came to Town Yesterday from Pilnitz for the Winter. Her Royal Highness the Princess Elizabeth is entirely recovered from her late Indisposition, and appeared Yesterday at the French Theatre.

Copenhagen, October 1. A fatal Accident happened a few Days ago to some of the Crew belonging to a Danish Man, returned from Bergen into this Port. About Forty Sailors, eager to get on Shore, crowded all into one Boat; which had no sooner hoisted Sail, than it over-set and sunk, whereby Thirty of them were drowned.

Hague, October 8. The French Ambassador, Marquis d'Havrincour, is expected back here at the End of this Month.

St. James's, October 10.

This Day his Excellency the Count de Seilern, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Emperor, And M. Landriani, Minister from the Duke of Modena, had private Audiences of Her Majesty.

To which they were introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Harcourt, Lord Chamberlain to Her Majesty; and conducted by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.

PUrsuant to an Act of Parliament passed in the Twenty Sixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, this is to give Notice to the Concerned, that Information has been sent to this Office, That on the 5th Instant, the Ship Mary of Inverness, of the Burthen of about Ninety Tons, whereof Charles M^eLean was Master, bound from Inverness to Bilboa with Salmon, struck on a Sand supposed to be Hap-pisburgh, and afterwards backed off about half a Cable's Length from the Sand, where the sunk, and with her Cargo is entirely lost; but that the Crew were saved by taking to their Boat, and brought into Yarmouth Roads by a Fishing Boat.

General Post-Office, June 8, 1765.

PUBLICK Notice is hereby given, That by an Act passed the last Session of Parliament, "For altering certain Rates of Postage, and for amending, explaining, and enlarging several Provisions in the Act of the Ninth of Queen Anne, and other Acts relating to the Post-Office;" It is, amongst other Things, Enacted,

That Letters between London and any Port within the British Dominions in America, (in which all His Majesty's West-India Islands are included) shall pay Single One Shilling, Double Two Shillings, Treble Three Shillings, the Ounce Four Shillings.

That Letters, by Sea, from any one Port to any other Port within the said Dominions, shall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence.

That Letters, by Land, or from any Chief Post-Office in America, from or to any other Part thereof not exceeding Sixty Miles from such Chief Post Office, or from the Office where such Letters, not passing through a Chief Office, may be put in, shall pay Single Four Pence, Double Eight Pence, Treble One Shilling, the Ounce One Shilling and Four Pence. And being upwards of Sixty, and not exceeding One Hundred
