Florence, November 2.

A COURIER arrived here last Week from Vienna, with Notice, that the Emperor had appointed Prince Kinski to bring the Order of Maria Teresa to the Great Duke.

The Funeral Obsequies for the late Emperor are to be performed next Week in the Cathedral Church, where very great and expensive Dispositions have been making for that Ceremony ever since the Great Duke's Arrival here.

Berlin, November 5. An Ordinance was published here, a few Days ago, by Authority, prohibiting, under the severest Penalties, all Games of Hazard, as well in publick as in private Houses: They are not so much as allowed during the Time of Carnival.
