Cologne, Jan. 14. Yefterday paffed by this City 20 Boats with Munfter Soldiers, who come from Treves, the Cavalry marches by Land; The Commiffary that is with the faid Troops demanded of our Magistrates fome Provisions for them, but he having no Money to pay for them, it was refused:

Hamburg, Jan. 10. It is most certain that the last night the Danish Troops which are quartered in our Neighborhood received orders to march; the march of these Troops makes some ready to believe the report that is in Town, that the Sleut Guldenlieu Viceroy of Norway, had been defeated in a Fight with the Suedes, and lost; or 6000 Men, and that he has written very carness of the King for a supply of Men,

Strasburg, Jan. 10. A party of 400 Foot and 50 Horfe, fent from Brifae, having within these few days burnt the Village Willen, near Rbinfelden; the fame party being reinforced with 1000 Men more, have been almost as far as Basse, setting all places under Contribution.

Capitulation made between the Suedes in Carelsburg, and the Confederates on the 7th of January.

That the place shall be surrendred on the 22 instant, in case before that time no confiderable succors of Men, Vistuals, and other Military Provisions be brought into it.

The Governor of the place shall on the faid 22 instant, by eight in the morning, deliver the Bridge and the Geeffendorper-Gate into the bands of the Confederates, and asterwards all the other Postsy tagether with an exact account of all the Provisions, Ammunision, Artillery, &c. And Ball give notice of all Strangers Goods and Moneys he knows to be in the place.

By 10 of the Clock on the fame day, the whole Garifon shall march out with Arms, Bag, and Baggage, &c. and two pieces of Cannon; Prifoners and Defenters being first restored on both fides.

The Garifon may not be convoyed to Stade, but failt have liberty to remain in the Torritories of the Confederates till Spring, when those that are Natives of Sueden may pass by Sea to Gottemburgh; in the mean time they shall have free quarters, and be provided with all necessfaries: And the Officers, shall have liberty upon their Farole to go and look after their concerns in Germany.

The German Officers and soldiers shall enter into the fervice of the Confederatos, or return home, and not ferve the Suedes any more, while in War with the Empire.

The Garifon when it marches out, thall not be obliged to uncafie marches, and the first day shall march onely to Shepdorp, where it shall be furnished with all necessaries.

The Garifon Shill have leave to take with it Provifions for 10 days, and the Wiggons and Horfet necessaby for their Baggage and Cannon.

The Inbabitants shall enjoy all farmer Priviledges, they that defire to depart shall have liberty so to do.

The Veffels that lie as prefent before the place be-

longi gto the Subjects of East-Frichand, fall be reftored to their Owners.

The Governor and the Garifon shall not during the faid term that they are in the Confederates Territories, be molisted or disturbed by one or the otier party.

That the fuid G vernor may keep the bester order in bis march, quarters, &c. Military Jurifdiction shall be continued to him.

In the faid murch and quarters, as often as it fhall be necessary, especially when he passes by any rown, he may cause his Drums to beat.

For the performance of which, 3 Officers are to be delivered on each fide as Hostiges.

Hegue, Jan. 17. We have now the confirmation that the Suedes in Carelsbu gb have made an accord with Monfieur Ceauver, who commands the C nfederars Troops employed againfb it, to furrender the place on the 22 inftant, if they be not reifeved before that time. The States of Luce have used great en-deavours to obtain a Neutrality for that Countrey; to which they have to far disposed the Most Christian King, as that he hath refolved to fend the Sieur Gravelle on his part, to treat with such as should be deputed by this state, and the Governor of the Spanif Netberlands, and Maribienne au Pont wa appointed for the meeting , the Refident of Liege here, makes it now his bulinels to prevail with this State likewife to lend thither, but hitherto meets with little fugceis in his follicitations; and on the other hand, we he r that the Dutch I roops which are quartered in the Diocels of Lisge, treat those Inha-bitants with great feverities. The States of Huland have been now two dayes affembled, and the Subject of their prefent de bates . is about raising a farther Sum of Money. A y Lord Ambaffador Jenkins having been flopt at Dois in his paffage by water to Nimega iby contrasy winds, w. understand that his Excellency went alhore there, and has taken his Journey by Land. Here hath been for fome dayes a report in Town of a Fight between the Suedes and the Danes in Va way, and that the latter had been worfted with confiderable lots.

Pavis, fan. 18. The jaft week the Ambaffador of the Republick of Varize had Audience of the King, to acquaint his Majefty that the Senate had make choice of Procurator Nami to be their Ambaffador and Pleninpotenu irry for the Treaty at Nimaguen, and that he will be very fuddenly on his journey thither. It is faid that the King journey is put off till the latter end of Feb zory. His Majefly underlianding that the Spaniards and Dutch had confected to the choice his Majefly had made of Marchienne au Pont, for the D puties to meet in, about reflabilihing the Neutrality of the Countrey of Linge, has appointed the Abbe de Gravelle to repait thith r on his part. From Clarke of they write, That the 3d inftant, the Governor of Nimur furprized about three a clock in the morning Chaff let, a finall Town in the Countrey of Linge, in which was two Companies of French Foot, and a Troop of Hoffe; there were only four of the French killed, the teft faving themfelves, fo that the Enemy made not any Prifoners, and after having pillaged the place, retired again Our Governor has fince put another and fronger Garifon there, and has caufed the place to be fortified with Palifadoes.
