THE Hanover Packet arrived here the 26th of December in Five Days, as did Yesterday the Hampden Packet in Six Days, from Falmouth. Their most Faithful Majesties, accompanied by Dom Luis da Cunha, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, went to Pinheiro on Monday the 6th Instant, and will return the 15th.
