*Lisbon*, January 25. Their Majesties set out  
on Saturday for Salvaterra, with the Princesses  
and the Infante Dom Pedro, accompanied by  
M. da Cunha; where, it is said, they will reside  
as usual until the Beginning of March.

Their Majesties put on Mourning Yesterday  
for his late Royal Highness Prince Frederick-  
William, for Fifteen Days.

Two Packets arrived Yesterday; the King  
George Packet in Nine Days, with the Mail of  
the 7th; and the Duke of York Packet in Five  
Days, with That of the 14th Instant.

*Copenhagen*, February 1. The several Apart-  
ments at Christiansbourg being now in Order,  
and the Mourning Equipages ready to be made  
Use of To-morrow, the King of Denmark,  
with the Queen Mother, and the Two Prin-  
cesses, return this Evening to reside again in  
Town.

The 29th past was his Danish Majesty's Birth-  
Day, when he entered into the 18th Year of  
his Age. The 30th was the Birth-Day of her  
Royal Highness the Princess Louisa, his Sister,  
who is just one Year younger than his Majesty;  
on Account of the present melancholy Situation  
of the Court neither of those Days was cele-  
brated with the usual Festivities. All who ap-  
peared at Fridericsberg came dressed in Black.  
The King however shewed himself in the Circle,  
dined in Publick with the Royal Family, and
