Two Packets arrived Yesterday; the King George Packet in Nine Days, with the Mail of the 7th; and the Duke of York Packet in Five

Days, with That of the 14th Instant.

Copenhagen, February 1. The several Apartments at Christiansbourg being now in Order, and the Mourning Equipages ready to be made. Use of To-morrow, the King of Denmark, with the Queen Mother, and the Two Princesses, return this Evening to reside again in Town.

The 29th past was his Danish Majesty's Birth-Day, when he entered into the 18th Year of his Age. The 30th was the Birth-Day of her Royal Highness the Princess Louisa, his Sister, who is just one Year younger than his Majesty; on Account of the present melancholy Situation of the Court neither of those Days was cele-brated with the usual Festivities. All who appeared at Fridericsberg came dressed in Black. The King however shewed himself in the Circle, dined in Publick with the Royal Family, and
