Naples, January 28.

A Few Days ago His Britannick Majesty's Frigate Montreal, Capt. Stuart, arrived in this Port.

Vienna, February 8. The late Marshal Daun having in his Will, which was addressed to the Empress, desired to be buried privately, her Imperial Majesty has been pleased to comply with his Request, and he was accordingly buried Yesterday without any of those Military Honors, which would otherwise have been paid him; and her Imperial Majesty, as a Mark of her Regard, has already given his Regiment to his Son, who is about Twenty.

Hague, February 18. The Attention of every Body is fixed upon the Ceremonies which are to take Place upon the Majority of the Prince Stadtholder: Many Persons are daily arriving from different Provinces to be present at them; and great Preparations for Rejoicings are making on that Occasion.

M. Kauderbach, who has resided here many Years as Resident and Minister from the Court of Saxony, has taken Leave of the States-General this Day, being recalled, but a Secretary of Legation will be left here.

This Day the Baron de la Perriere, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sardinia; Count Bothmar, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark;

And M. Rouffel, Minister from the Bishop of Liege; had private Audiences of her Royal Highness Princess Amelia.

St. James's, February 3, 1766.

Whereas I have received Information from his Excellency the Earl of Hertford, His Majesty's Lieutenant General and General Governor of the Kingdom of Ireland. That Part of the Cargo and Treasure of the Ship Earl of Sandwich, whereof John Cochran was late Commander, (who in his Voyage in her, from Tenerife to London, was, together with Captain Glass, his Wife and Daughter, Passengers, and some others belonging to the said Ship, barbarously murdered by Part of the Crew thereof) having been found on the Coast of Ireland, is now properly secured in that Kingdom by his Excellency's Order; I give this Publick Notice thereof, to the End, that all Persons concerned in the Treasure and Cargo of the said Ship, so found and secured as above-mentioned, may, without Loss of Time, authorize proper Persons to lay in their Claims, in the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland's Chief Secretary's Office in Dublin Castle, and agree upon a Method for settling and ascertaining their respective Properties and Proportions.
