Westminster, March 18.

THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molineux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty, by a Land-Tax, to be raised in Great-Britain, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and sixty-six.

An Act to remove a Doubt concerning such Part of an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, as relates to the ascertaining of the Duties upon the Importation of certain Linnen Cloth of the Manufacture of Russia; and to obviate all Doubts with respect to the Importation of Tea, under certain Licences authorized to be granted by an Act made in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty.

An Act for Punishing Mutiny and Desertion; and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act for the better Securing the Dependency of His Majesty's Dominions in America upon the Crown and Parliament of Great-Britain.

An Act to repeal an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for granting and applying certain Stamp Duties and other Duties in the British Colonies and Plantations in America, towards further defraying the Expences of Defending, Protecting, and Securing the same, and for amending such Parts of the several Acts of Parliament relating to the Trade and Revenues of the said Colonies and Plantations, as direct the Manner of Determining and Recovering the Penalties and Forfeitures therein mentioned.

An Act to indemnify such Persons as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments; and to indemnify Justices of the Peace, Deputy Lieutenants, and Officers of the Militia, or others, who have omitted to register or deliver in their Qualifications within the Time limited by Law, and for giving further Time for these Purposes; and to indemnify Members and Officers in Cities, Corporations, and Borough Towns,

whose Admissions have been omitted to be stamped according to the several Acts of Parliament now in Force for that Purpose, or, having been stamped, have been lost or mislaid; and for allowing them Time to provide Admissions duly stamped.

An Act for enlarging the Terms and Powers of two Acts, one of the Twelfth of King George the First, and the other of the Fourteenth of His late Majesty, for repairing the Road from Horsley Upright Gate to the Top of Kingsdown Hill in the County of Wilts; and for amending several Roads near or adjoining to the said Road.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act of the Fourth Year of His late Majesty, for repairing the Road from Gosstone in the County of Surrey, to Highgate in the Parish of East Grinstead in the County of Sussex.

An Act for Repairing and Widening the Road from Beverley, by Molscroft, to Bainton Balk in the County of York.

An Act for the better Regulation of Pilots for the Conducting of Ships and Vessels into and out of the Port of Liverpool.

And to Seventeen Private Bills.

Vienna, March 5. The Empress-Queen has purchased the late Marshal Daun's House at Luxemburg, and given it to the second Archduchess.

The Circumstances of the Sovereign's being present on these Occasions, which is an ancient Formality, has been omitted for some Years.
