Naples, March 25.

ON Saturday last his Sicilian Majesty came to Naples in order to assist at the Ceremonies of the Holy Week; and is to return to Portici immediately after, instead of going to Caserta as usual, the Small-Pox being very much in that Neighbourhood.

This Court has put on Mourning for the late King Stanislaus, which is to last four Weeks.

Mount Vesuvius continues to throw up great Quantities of Stones.

Vienna, April 2. Some Days ago the Emperor dissolved the Aulic Council, which has been commonly considered as a Matter of Form, and repeated once in the Beginning of every Reign; and after the Holidays the Members thereof will be appointed.

This Morning Prince Albert of Saxony, attended with a numerous Retinue, went to Court, and, in a Publick Audience, demanded of the Empress Dowager and the Emperor, the Archduchess Marie Christine in Marriage. There was afterwards a Dinner, at which the whole Imperial Family assisted; and this Evening there will be a Drawing-Room. The Marriage will be celebrated next Week at Schloßhoff, for which Place the Empress-Queen and the whole Court will set out on Monday next.

Berlin, April 5. The King continues in perfect Health at Potsdam; and assists daily at the Military Exercises of the Troops in Garrison there. A few Days ago his Majesty commanded and exercised in Person, for upwards of two Hours, his First Battalion of Guards.

Her Royal Highness the Princess of Prussia has been for some Days confined to her Room at Potsdam, by a slight Indisposition, but is now perfectly recovered.

Orders have been given for this Court's going into Mourning for Four Weeks, for the late King Stanislaus.

Copenhagen, April 5. Count Gyldenstålpe has brought from Sweden the Ensigns of the Order of the Seraphim for the King of Denmark.

On the 3d Instant the Marriage between their Royal Highnesses the Prince Royal of Sweden and the Princess Royal of Denmark, was declared at Court. The Mourning was suspended

for that Day, and every Body appeared in Gala. In the Evening there was a Drawing-Room; and at Night an elegant Supper at Court; the Whole concluded with Illuminations and other Tokens of Joy.

Young Count Scheel is to carry back the Order of the Elephant to the Prince Royal of Sweden; and it is expected he will set out the Beginning of next Week.

Hague, April 11. The Prince of Orange goes to Leyden on Tuesday next, to be installed as Curator of the University, when his Serene Highness will be entertained at Dinner, and a magnificent Fire Work be played off in the Evening, at the Expence of the Students.

Whitehall, April 15.

The King has been pleased to order His Letter Recommendatory to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul, London, to elect and admit George Secker, Doctor in Divinity, into the Place of Canon Residentiary of that Cathedral Church, vacant by the Death of Dr. John Taylor, late Canon Residentiary thereof.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Henneage Dering, Master of Arts, the Place and Dignity of a Canon or Prebendary of the Metropolitan Church of Canterbury, void by the Resignation of Dr. George Secker, late Canon thereof.

St. James's, April 13.

This Day M. Alexis Moufin Pouchkin, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Empress of Russia, had a private Audience of her Royal Highness the Hereditary Princess of Brunswick.

To which he was introduced by Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.
