*Stockholm, April 1.*

**T**HE Publication of the Prince Royal of Sweden's intended Marriage with the Princess of Denmark, is to be made here next Thursday with great Ceremony.

*Copenhagen, April 8.* Baron Korff, the Russian Envoy, who has resided many Years at this Court, died here Yesterday.

*Hague, April 15.* The Prince of Orange went this Morning, with a great Retinue, to Leiden, to be installed at the Head of the University, and will return to this Place Tonight.

*St. James's, April 19.*
