*Stockholm, April 1.*

**T**HE Publication of the Prince Royal of Sweden's intended Marriage with the Princess of Denmark, is to be made here next Thursday with great Ceremony.

*Copenhagen, April 8.* Baron Korff, the Russian Envoy, who has resided many Years at this Court, died here Yesterday.

*Hague, April 15.* The Prince of Orange went this Morning, with a great Retinue, to Leiden, to be installed at the Head of the University, and will return to this Place To-night.

*St. James's, April 19.*

The King has been pleased to grant unto Sir Richard Lyttelton, Knight of the Bath, Lieutenant-General of His Majesty's Forces, the Office of Governor of the Island of Guernsey and Castle of Cornet, and the Islands and Territories thereunto belonging, the Island of Alderney only excepted, in the room of John Earl Delawarr deceased.

The King has been pleased to grant unto William Whitmore, Esq; the Office of Keeper of the Change and Money within His Majesty's Tower of London, and Keeper of the Coinage of Gold and Silver within that Part of Great Britain called England, in the room of John Jeffreys, Esq; deceased.

*April 15.*

This Day M. Alexis Mousin Pouchkin, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Empress of Russia, had a private Audience of her Royal Highness the Princess Amelia.

To which he was introduced by Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

*Whitehall, April 19, 1766.*

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing and Sending the said Incendiary Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Incendiary Letter) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; and also a Reward of One Hundred Pounds, to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.

And, as a farther Encouragement, the said Mr. Archdeacon Robert Oliver, does promise a Reward of Twenty Guineas to any Person making such Discovery, (except as before excepted) to be paid upon the Conviction of any one or more of the offenders.

*St. James's, February 3, 1766.*

Whereas I have received Information from his Excellency the Earl of Hertford, His Majesty's Lieutenant General and General Governor of the Kingdom of Ireland, That Part of the Cargo and Treasure of the Ship Earl of Sandwich, wherof John Cochran was late Commander. (who in his Voyage in her, from Teneriff to London, was, together with Captain Guays, his Wife and Daughter, offenders, and some others belonging to the said Ship, barbarously murdered by Part of the Crew thereof) having been found on the coast of Ireland, is now properly secured in that Kingdom by his Excellency's Order; I give this Publick Notice thereof, to the End, that all Persons concerned in the Treasure and Cargo of the said Ship, so found and secured as abovementioned, may, without Loss of Time, authorize proper Persons to lay in their Claims, in the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland's Chief Secretary's Office in Dublin Castle, and agree upon a Method for settling and ascertaining their respective Properties and Proportions.
