Turin, May 28.

HIS Britannick Majesty's Ship the Vulture, commanded by Capt. Robinson, was forced into the Port of Villafrauca, the 12th Instant, by contrary Winds, in his Voyage from Genoa to Mahone.

The 24th in the Evening his Sardinian Majesty, with the Royal Family, went to the Venerie.

Berlin, May 31. On the 24th Instant, early in the Morning, the King of Prussia, accompanied by his Nephews the Prince Royal, young Prince Henry of Prussia, and the Two Princes of Brunswick in this Service, set out from Charlottenbourg, for Custrin and Stargard in Pomerania, to review the Troops assembled in those Places; and last Thursday he returned from that Expedition to Potsdam, where his Stay will be very short, as he designs, on the 3d of next Month, to review a Corps of Troops at Magdebourg; after which he is to pay a Visit to the Brunswick Family at Salzdahl.

A few Days ago M. Michel, formerly Prussian Minister in England, and who was lately appointed by the King of Prussia Vice-Governor of Neufchatel, set out for that Place, in order to take Possession of his Government.

Copenhagen, May 31. M. Ogier, the French Ambassador, set out on Wednesday last the 28th, on his Return to France, after a Residence of above thirteen Years at this Court.

Two Deputies from the Town of Hambourg arrived here a few Days since, and Yesterday waited on the King to compliment his Majesty on his Accession to the Throne.
