The Commissioners for Victualling His Majesty's Navy do hereby give Notice, that on Monday the 21st of July next, exactly at Twelve o'Clock at Noon, they will be ready to treat with such Persons as may be willing to undertake to furnish Sea Provisions to such of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels as may touch at Appledore Pool in the Port of Barnstaple, and be in Want thereof; also Fresh Beef on a separate Contract.

THE King's Plate of One Hundred Pounds will be run for on Lewes Downs in Sussex, on Thursday the 7th of August next, by any Horse, Mare, or Gelding, being no more than Six Years old the Gra's before, as must be certified under the Hands of the Breeder, carrying twelve Stone, the best of three Heats, round the Course. To be shewn and entered at Verrall's Coffee-House in Lewes, on Wednesday the 6th Day of August next, or they are not to run for the said Plate: And if any Difference arises relating to their Ages, Entering, or Running, the same to be determined by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, or whom he shall appoint, according to such His Majesty's Orders or Rules as shall be produced at the Place of Entering or Running for the said Plate.

And on Friday the 8th of August next, a Plate of Fifty Pounds will be run for by any Horse, Mare, or Gelding, being no more than Five Years old the Gra's before, that may win a Plate or Match of the Value of Fifty Pounds at any Time before, carrying ten Stone. Every Horse, Mare, or Gelding, running for the said Plate, shall be shewn and entered at Verrall's Coffee-house in Lewes, one Week before Running: And each Horse, Mare, or Gelding, to pay three Guineas Entrance, and Two Shillings and Six-pence to the Clerk of the Course: The Entrance-Money to go to the Second best Horse, not distanced, winning one clear Heat before or after the Plate is determined. Every Horse, Mare, or Gelding, so Entering for the said Plate, shall produce a Certificate of its Age on the Day of Entrance, and to run according to the King's Plate Articles.

And on Saturday the 9th of August next, another Plate of Fifty Pounds will be run for by any Five Years old, Six Years old, and Aged Horses, Mares, or Geldings, in Manner following; Five Years old to carry Nine Stone, Six Years old to carry Nine Stone Seven Pounds, and Aged to carry Ten Stone. Every Horse, Mare, or Gelding, having won Fifty Pounds and upwards, in either Plate or Match, to carry Seven Pounds more than the Maiden Horse, Mare or Gelding, of the same Age. Every Horse, Mare, or Gelding, running for the said Plate, shall be shewn and entered at Verrall's Coffee-house in Lewes, one Week before Running; and each Horse, Mare, or Gelding, to pay Three Guineas Entrance, and Two Shillings and Six-pence to the Clerk of the Course. The Entrance-Money to go to the Second best Horse, Mare, or Gelding, not distanced, winning one clear Heat before or after the Plate is determined. Every Horse, Mare, or Gelding, so Entering for the said Plate, to produce a Certificate of its Age and Qualifications, on the Day of Entrance; and to run according to the King's Plate Articles.

The winning Horse, Mare, or Gelding, of the two last Days Plates, to pay One Guinea and a half, for the Use of the Scales, Weights, Colours, and Drums.
