The King has been pleased to grant unto the Right Honourable Frederick-Augustus Earl of Berkeley the Offices of Constable of the Castle of St. Briavells in the Forest of Dean in the County of Gloucester, and of Keeper of the Deer and Woods in the said Forest.

*Dresden, June 25.* The Emperor arrived here Yesterday in the Afternoon, and went in the Evening, accompanied by the whole Electoral Family, to the Italian Comic Opera. At Night there was a most splendid Supper in the great Apartments of the Palace, to which the Ladies of the First Rank at this Court, and the Foreign Ministers, were invited. A little before Supper all the Foreign Ministers and Strangers of Distinction, that happened to be here, were presented to him. The Emperor's Retinue is a very small one: The principal Persons that attend him are, Field Marshal Lacy, Count Wied, and Count Dietrichstein. His Imperial Majesty travels on Horse-back, escorted only by a small Party of his own Dragoons. The Emperor leaves this Place on Friday, and goes directly to Torzau, to view the Field of battle there; and will then, it is said, return into Bohemia through Lusatia.
