Whereas William Earl of Sutherland was
duly elected and returned to be One of
the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to sit in the House
of Peers in the present Parliament of Great
Britain, and is since deceased; In order to the
Electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his
Room, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy
Council, issue forth this Proclamation, strictly
charging and commanding all the Peers of Scot-
land to assemble and meet at Holy Rood House
in Edinburgh, on Thursday the 21st Day of
August next, between the Hours of Twelve and
Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choose
Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choose
another Peer of Scotland, to sit and vote in the
House of Peers of this present Parliament of
Great Britain, in the room of the said William
Earl of Sutherland deceased, by open Election
and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall
then be present, and of the Proxies of such as
shall be absent, (such Proxies being Peers) and
producing a Mandate in Writing, duly signed
before Witnesses, and both Constituent and
Proxy being qualified according to Law. And
the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the
Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be ap-
pointed by him to officiate in his Name, are
hereby respectively required to attend such Meet-
ing, and to administer the Oaths required by
Law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to
take their Votes; and immediately after such
Election made, and duly examined, to certify
the Name of the Peer so elected, and sign and
attest the same in the Presence of the said Peers,
and return such Certificate into Our High Court

of Chancery of Great Britain. And We strictly
charge and command, that this Proclamation be
duly published at the Market Cross at Edin-
burgh, and in all the County Towns in Scot-
land, Twenty-five Days at least before the Time
hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said
Peers to proceed on such Election.
