"Mrs Wakefield We do defire you will not let the Yong Gentelman make no more such a dangerous atempt as he did last Night to look out at "the Window when we was in the adjoyning Gar-dans for if he had continued there 2 Minuets " longer we should have fired at you and so we " will the first that attempts to open a Window any " more I am afraid we must take the lives of some " of you before you will leave itt, for By God we will poison the Waters for as we wrote before "we will fooner die than dropt itt, we shall never write to you more you have had Netice enough."
