THE Ambassadors from Lucca, with the Four Gentlemen who accompanied them, sat out this Morning on their Return Home.

The Empress Queen, and all the Imperial Family, removed Yesterday from Luxembourg to Schonbrun, where they will continue the Remainder of the Summer. The Empress has left Baden, and is gone thither also.

The Emperor is to be at Aufferlitz the 19th or 20th Instant.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable William Earl of Shelburne to be one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, his Lordship was this Day, by His Majesty's Command, upon one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint his Grace Augustus Henry Fitzroy Duke of Grafton, the Right Honourable Charles Townshend, Thomas Townshend, George Onslow, and Pryse Campbell, Esqrs. to be His Majesty's Commissioners for Executing the Office of Treasurer of His Majesty's Exchequer.

This Day his Excellency the Prince de Masferano, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of Spain, had a Private Audience of His Majesty, to notify the Death of the Dowager Queen of Spain.

To which he was introduced by his Grace the Duke of Richmond, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; and conducted by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.
