*Constantinople, July 15.*

**T**HE Rebels in Cyprus are become so powerful, that they had, on the 5th of June, actually formed the Blockade of Nicosia, the Capital of the Island, and would not permit Provisions of any Sort to be carried into the City, though the Inhabitants were in great Want; and they threatened to lay Siege to the Town in a few Days.

There has lately been another Shock of an Earthquake, and the Plague still continues at Pera.

The Polish Envoy Extraordinary had his private Audience of the Grand Vizir last Saturday, and this Morning that of the Grand Signior. The new Internuncio made his publick Entry on Thursday last, and is to have his Audiences at the Porte a Fortnight hence.

*Naples, July 29.* On Thursday last an Express arrived here, in thirteen Days, from Aranjuez, with the Account of the Death of the Queen Dowager of Spain; upon which an Order was immediately issued for a Mourning of Six Months, and all publick Diversions are suspended for one Month.

Count Catanti, his Sicilian Majesty's Minister at the Hague, has been appointed Minister from this Court to That of Denmark.

*St. Idephonso, August 4.* His Catholick Majesty, and the Royal Family, removed from the Escorial hither, on the 28th of last Month.

The Prince of Asturias has a little Return of his Ague. Don John Cermenno is come from Badajoz, to take possession of his new Employment of Commandant of the Engineers, and has been graciously received by his Catholick Majesty.

*Dublin, August 14.*

Tuesday last being the Anniversary of the Birth of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon their Excellencies the Lords Justices received the Compliments of the Nobility and Gentry on the

Occasion; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Rejoicings throughout the whole City.
