

Surrey and Suffex Turnpikes.

A Special Meeting of the Trustees for repairing and amending the Turnpike Roads in the Counties of Surrey and Suffex, will be held at the Bell Inn at Godstone, on Saturday the 20th Day of September, 1766, at Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon, to Lease out to the best Bidder, for the Term of Three Years from Michaelmas Day following, the Old Tolls and the Additional Tolls payable at Blue Anchor Lane Gate near Godstone in Surrey, and the Old and Additional Tolls payable at East Grinstead Gate in the County of Suffex, or any other Gates or Bars that shall be erected during such Lease, between the White Hart Inn at Godstone aforesaid and Highgate at the Entrance into Ashdown Forest in the County of Suffex, subject to all the Turnpike Laws now subsisting; and if any Alteration in the Tolls shall be made by Law, then the Lease to be determinable at the End of the first or second Year, upon Six Months Notice being given either by the Trustees or Lessee.

Any Person or Persons willing to take the said Lease or Leases, may deliver their Proposals in Writing, (sealed up) at the Time and Place above-mentioned; but no Proposal will be accepted under the clear yearly Rent of 300*l.* for the Old and Additional Tolls payable at Blue Anchor Lane Gate, and the clear yearly Rent of 300*l.* for the Old and Additional Tolls payable at East Grinstead Gate, by equal Monthly Payments, one Month's Payment to be advanced and paid at Executing the Lease, and to continue in Hand till the Expiration thereof.
