St. James's, September 23.

Esterday being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, there was a grand Appearance of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers, to compliment His Miesty on that Occasion. At Noon the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired; and in the Evening there were Bonsires, Illuminations, and other Publick Demonstrations of Joy.

St. James's, September 17, 1766:

She found a Letter, which some Perjon bad thrown over the said Door into the Entry adpiring, directed to the Old Tom How; which Letter she immediately carried to her said Master, supposing it was directed to him; and that the said Letter, and is Direction, were in the following Words, viz.

" To the Old Tom How."-

"Mr Roge—You must know yourself that You have been guilty of every Thing that is bad, "excepting Murder, therefore We are determined that You taile something of Hell here upon Earth, as shore as Thee hast a Soul in the Body thou must be rosted in the Bed before this Winter is over and as for the Son We will fold Him up One Night or other—We have sworn and will perform:"
