**T**HIS Morning Charles Maddocks, one of His Majesty's Messengers, arrived here with an Account, that her Majesty the Queen of Denmark embarked, on Friday last about Twelve o'Clock, on Board the Mary Yacht, which soon after anchored off the Harbour: Yesterday Afternoon a Signal was given to weigh; and in the Evening, about Six o'Clock, was clear of the Harbour, with the Wind at N. W.

Constantinople, September 1. Since the violent Shock of an Earthquake here on the 5th of last Month, we have had only a few slight ones; so that the People again begin to take Courage, and the Repairs of this City go on surprizingly quick: But the publick Gates and Arches in many Parts of the Town are rebuilt with Wood instead of Stone.

Baron Penkler, the Imperial Internuncio, had his Audience of the Grand Vizir, on Wednesday last, to take Leave; from whom he received the Grand Signior's Letter to the Emperor.

Hamburgh, September 30. Their Serene Highnesses the Dutchess of Mecklenburgh-Schwerin, with the Princess Ulrique, sat out on Sunday last from their Hotel in this City, on their Return to Schwerin.

To-morrow the Danish Envoy, Baron Schimmelmann, will give a grand Ball on Account of the Celebration of the Double Marriage.
