Corinna, October 4.

ON the 23d of last Month arrived at Ferrol from Buenos Ayres, in Eighty-two Days, a Spanish Man of War called the Magnanime, and brings 1,556,000 Rixdollars, besides other Merchandize.

Naples, October 14. The Palace of the Duke of Matalone is fitting up, by his Sicilian Majesty's Order, for the Reception of his Serene Highness the Hereditary Prince of Brunswick.

Leghorn, October 20. On Monday last his Serene Highness the Hereditary Prince of Brunswick arrived here in perfect Health, and departed on Wednesday Morning for Rome.

Paris, October 29. His Excellency the Earl of Rochford, his Britannick Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to this Court, arrived here Yesterday with the Countess of Rochford.

Dublin, October 25.

Thursday last being the Anniversary of the Irish Rebellion in 1641, their Excellencies the Lord Justices proceeded in the usual State to Christ Church, escorted by a Squadron of Horse; where a most excellent Sermon was preached by the Rev. Dr. Richard Chalmers Cobb upon that Occasion. The sword of State was carried to and from the Church by the Right Honorable Nathaniel Clements. After their Excellencies Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

Dublin, October 28.

Saturday last being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Accession to the Throne, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower: At Noon their Excellencies the Lords Justices received the Compliments of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction, at the Castle: The Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
