**W**Hereas the Lords Spiritual and Tem-  
poral, in Parliament assembled, have  
this Day presented an humble Ad-  
drefs to His Majesty, that He would  
be graciously pleased to, order the Time of the  
Embargo, laid upon all Ships laden or to be laden  
with Wheat or Wheat Flour, to be extended;  
and that His Majesty would be graciously pleased  
to order an Additional Embargo to be forthwith  
laid upon all Ships laden or to be laden with  
Barley or Malt to be exported to Foreign Parts.  
And whereas the House of Commons have like-  
wise this Day presented an humble Address to  
His Majesty for the like Purposes—His Majesty  
in Council, taking both the said Addreffes into  
Consideration, is thereupon pleased to order,  
That the Embargo, laid by Order in Council of  
the 26th Day of September last, upon all Ships  
and Vessels laden or to be laden in the Ports of  
Great-Britain with Wheat or Wheat Flour to  
be exported to Foreign Parts, be continued from  
the Expiration of the Time limited by the said  
Order. And His Majesty is hereby further  
pleased to order, that an Additional Embargo be  
forthwith laid upon all Ships and Vessels laden  
or to be laden, in the Ports of Great-Britain,  
with Barley or Malt to be exported to Foreign  
Parts. And the Right Honourable the Lords  
Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the  
Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord  
Warden of the Cinque Ports, and His Majesty's  
Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Di-  
rections herein, as to them may respectively  
appertain.
