AT the Court at St. James's, the 3d Day of December, 1766,

P R E S E N T,
The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland was, by His Majesty's Command, introduced into the Privy-Council by the Right Honourable the Earl of Northampton, Lord President; and his Royal Highness took his Place at the Council-Board.

This Day the Right Honourable John Shelley, Esq; Treasurer of His Majesty's Household, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Stockholm, November 8. The King has bestowed the Dignity of a Count upon Baron Scheffer, formerly the Prince Royal's Governor, and of a Baron upon Mess. Lagerbielke, Sinclair, Ramsay, and Wallenstierna: His Majesty has likewise made Count Rosen, the late Senator's Son, Marshal of the Court.

Stockholm, November 10. The Marriage of the Prince Royal was celebrated, with great Solemnity, in the Royal Chapel, last Tuesday Evening; after which the Royal Family supped in Publick with the Senators.

On Wednesday the whole Town was illuminated, and the Royal Family passed three Hours in a Tour through the Streets, to see the Illuminations.

On Thursday Morning the Foreign Ministers were admitted to make their Compliments to the Royal Family; after which they were entertained by the President of the Chancery at Dinner; and in the Evening there was a Comedy and Ball, that lasted till Four o'Clock on Friday Morning.

This was the last of the Festivals given on Occasion of the Marriage; but in order to continue the Publick Diversions, there will be a Court three Evenings in the Week, and a Comedy the other three Evenings, till Christmas.

Berlin, November 22. The King of Prussia still continues at Potsdam in perfect good Health; but he is expected in this Capital about the Middle of next Month. Last Wednesday their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess Ferdinand of Prussia came to Town for the Winter Season from their Country seat at Frederick-felde.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing the said anonymous threatening incendiary Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Fact, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof: And also a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to the Person making such Discovery; to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
