Westminster, December 16.

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Robert Quarme, Esq; Yeoman Usher of the House of Peers, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Earls of Huntingdon, Marchmont, and Bristol, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to,*

An Act for continuing, and granting to His Majesty, certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cider, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty seven.

An Act for indemnifying such Persons as have acted for the Service of the Public, in advising or carrying into Execution the Order of Council of the Twenty-sixth Day of September last, for laying an Embargo on all Ships laden with Wheat, or Wheat Flour; and for preventing Suits in Consequence of the said Embargo.

An Act to prohibit, for a limited Time, the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, and Starch; and also the Extraction of Low Wines and Spirits from Wheat, and Wheat Flour.

An Act to continue an Act made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, for a limited Time.

An Act to amend so much of an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for Repealing certain Duties in the British Colonies and Plantations, granted by several Acts of Parliament, and also the Duties imposed by an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, upon certain East-India Goods exported from Great Britain, and for granting other Duties instead thereof, and for further encouraging, regulating, and securing, several Branches of the Trade of this Kingdom, and the British Dominions in America, as relates to the Exportation of Non-Enumerated Goods from the British Colonies in America.

An Act for allowing the Importation of Wheat, and Wheat Flour, from His Majesty's Colonies in America, into this Kingdom, for a limited Time, free of Duty.

An Act for allowing the Importation of Wheat, and Wheat Flour, from any Part of Europe, into this Kingdom, for a limited Time, free of Duty.

An Act for allowing the Importation of Oats and Oatmeal, Rye and Ryemeal, into this Kingdom, for a limited Time, free of Duty.

An Act for obviating Doubts, which have arisen with respect to so much of an Act made in the First Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, (intituled, An Act to amend an Act passed in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of King George the Second, concerning the Qualification of Justices of the Peace, and for other Purposes therein mentioned) as directs the taking of certain Oaths by Justices of the Peace, on the Issuing of any new Commission of the Peace.

An Act for repairing and widening several Roads in the County of Brecon.

Escorial, November 24. The Removal of this Court to Madrid is fixed for the first of December.

Don Jorge Juan, Chef d'Escadre, and Commandant of the Marine Guards at Cadiz, is appointed, by his Catholick Majesty, his Ambassador to Morocco.

Stockholm, November 25. On Sunday last Baron Shack had a private Audience of the King of Sweden, and of the rest of the Royal Family, to notify the King his Master's Marriage; and Yesterday being the Day on which the anniversary Chapter of the King of Sweden's Orders is held, his Majesty gave the vacant Blue Ribbon to Senator Lagerbielke, and the Commanderies

of the Order of the Sword to the two Barons Wallenstierna and Sinclair, and to General Lillienberg.

Those of the Polar Star were bestowed upon the Senator Count Gyllenstierna, upon President Lillienberg, and upon Baron Stromfelt the Governor of Bleking.

Besides which, the King also declared Count Hord, who is a Major General in the Prussian Service, to be a Supernumerary Commander of the Order of the Sword upon the same footing as Baron Schwerin had the Blue Ribbon last Year; and President Hermanfen was made Secretary of the King's Orders, in the room of Baron Duben, now a Senator.

Copenhagen, November 29. The Queen Mother Sophia Magdalena Yesterday entered into her sixty-seventh Year; upon which Occasion the Court was in Gala.

One of this East-India Company's Ships from Tranquebar, is just arrived here.

Lisbon, November 29. The Chevalier de St. Pricit, his most Christian Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary to this Court, having asked and obtained Leave of Absence for Six Months, will return in a short Time through England to France.

Whitehall, December 16.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honourable Robert Nugent, Soame Jenyns, Edward Elliot, George Rice, John Roberts, Jeremiah Dyfon, William Fitzherbert, and Thomas Robinson, Esqrs. to be Commissioners for promoting Trade, and for inspecting and improving His Majesty's Plantations in America and elsewhere.

Dublin, December 2.

Sunday last being the Anniversary of the Birth of her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery, in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix, were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. And Yesterday at Noon there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction, at the Castle, to compliment their Excellencies the Lords Justices on the Occasion. In the Evening there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
